





Q1 What is your age?




Q2 What is your gender?




Q3 Where do you live?

75% of Americans believe that individuals with obesity should have access to effective medical treatments, just like those with other chronic conditions.




Q5 Do you believe that individuals with obesity should have access to effective medical treatments, just like those with other chronic conditions like diabetes or heart disease?

Responses by political affiliation:

- 74% Republicans
- 83% Democrats
- 72% Independents

78% of Americans think it's important for Medicare to cover medications proven to help people manage their weight and improve their overall health.



Responses by age:

- 84% of Americans 65+
- 79% of 35-64
- 73% of 18-34

77% of Americans agree that providing access to obesity medications through government health programs could help reduce healthcare costs in the long run.



Responses by age:

- 84% of Americans 65+
- 77% of 35-64
- 70% of 18-34

71% of Americans support the Trump administration finalizing a proposed policy change that would expand Medicare coverage to include obesity treatment.




Q6 Would you support the Trump administration finalizing a proposed policy change that would expand Medicare coverage to include obesity treatment under the care of your healthcare provider, including prescription medications, for individuals who meet specific medical criteria?

Responses by political affiliation:

- 79% Republicans
- 73% Democrats
- 66% Independents

73% of Americans support the Trump administration or Congress expanding Medicare coverage so that more people could have access to IBT.



Q7 Would you support the Trump administration or Congress expanding Medicare coverage so that more people who meet specific medical criteria could have access to intensive behavioral therapy such as screening and frequent counseling to help change eating and exercise habits for the treatment of obesity?

Responses by political affiliation:

- 82% Republicans
- 74% Democrats
- 70% Independents
